Purpose:

The program goal of the Indigenous Youth Work Exchange Program (IYWEP) is to provide an Indigenous Youth with advanced training, job skills, experience and networks to support future career opportunities in natural resources and/or the Ontario Public Service (OPS). In addition, the Program enables Indigenous Youth to positively contribute to the economy and sustainability of our communities/regions.

Eligible Student Participants

To be eligible to participate in the Aboriginal Youth Work Exchange Program (AYWEP), individuals must:

Preference will be given to students enrolled in a Natural Resource or an Environmental Studies program at an Ontario University or College or has an interest in pursuing Lands and Resources as a career and must be:

- A resident of Ontario
- Legally able to work in Canada
- Must be between the ages of 15-24 (29 if a person with a disability) at the time of hire
- Able to self-identify as Aboriginal
- Has been registered as a full-time student in the previous academic year and intends to return to school on a full-time basis in the next academic year
- Must submit copy of current year school report card/ transcripts and attendance

- Knowledge of the use of recreational equipment would be an asset

Personal Attributes

Work Site Location:

The other two positions will be situated in the successful candidates First Nation community and may include the research and development of mapping of certain Williams Treaties territories and working with the successful applicants First Nation in lands, environmental and sustainability projects.
