Nurse Practitioner

POSITION SUMMARY:

The Nurse Practitioner provides health promotion, disease prevention and illness management for individuals, families, and groups within the Alderville First Nation Community. You will act as the individual's or family's first point of contact with the health care system, similar to the role of a Family Physician. You will work collaboratively with other health care professionals to support the health and well-being of AFN members.

KEY JOB FUNCTIONS:

- Provides primary, holistic, and integrated health care to all ages, but with an emphasis on home visits to AFN's aging population.
- Assesses and diagnoses client health for acute illnesses and support clients to manage chronic illnesses.
- Works with the client and the community to promote healthy lifestyles and disease prevention.
- Collaborates and consults with members of the Health & Social Services interdisciplinary team to address issues experienced by clients and within the community and situations that are outside their scope of practice or exceed their knowledge and/or skill.
- Supports the development, implementation, and operation of an onsite Assisted Living Facility.

PRINCIPLE DUTIES

- Provides complete health assessments including health history and physical examination.
- Provides wellness care, health screening and education.
- Diagnoses and treats illness and injury.
- Screens for, treats, and monitors chronic illness, collaborating and consulting with physician as required in accordance with the standards for physician consultation.
- Provides care for episodic illness.
- Monitors ongoing therapy of clients with chronic, stable illness.
- Utilizes nursing strategies with a foundation of evidence-based practice.
- Assesses, diagnoses, orders, interprets medical tests, prescribes medications, and collaborates in the care of patients.
- Performs assessments, diagnosis, treatment, health education/counselling and other clinical activities according to the CNO standards of practice.
- Maintains accurate, concise, and confidential documentation.
- Documents appropriately within the Electronic Medical Record (EMR) and other avenues of documentation as required.
- Facilitates continuity of care by working in collaboration with professional health care teams, including specialists.
- Determines the need for health promotion and prevention strategies for patients, families, and caregivers.
- Advocates for patients, families and caregivers as required.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Baccalaureate or Master's Degree in nursing from a recognized university required.
- Nurse Practitioner Certification from an accredited program.

Specialization required:

- Registration with the College of Nurses of Ontario in the Extended Class (NP Adult).
- Member of Nurse Practitioner's Association of Ontario (NPAO) preferred, with professional liability insurance.
